A Message from LG&E

LG&E crews and support personnel will be working around the clock to restore service safely and as quickly as possible for customers impacted by this week's storms. Multiple rounds of heavy rainfall are expected through the weekend, and flooding will become more widespread later in the week as additional storms move across our community.

First and foremost, LG&E says keeping the community safe is the priority. Please follow the tips below to help keep you and your family safe and prepared.

• **Downed Power Line Safety:** High winds can bring down trees and power lines. Please remember to **stay far away** from any downed wires. Always assume they're live and dangerous. Keep everyone away and call LG&E immediately to report them: 502-589-1444 or 800-331-7370 (fast path 1-1-3)

- **Stay informed:** Keep up with the latest weather alerts (and be sure to keep your phone charged and notifications on at night) and download the utility's <u>mobile app</u>. It's the easiest way to report and track outages.
- **Ready your emergency kit:** Having an emergency kit handy is always a good idea. Here are some essential items to include:
 - Flashlights with extra batteries.
 - A battery-operated weather radio (a NOAA weather radio is ideal).
 - A first-aid kit with any necessary medications.
 - Water and nonperishable food.
 - A fully charged power bank for your phones and devices.
